

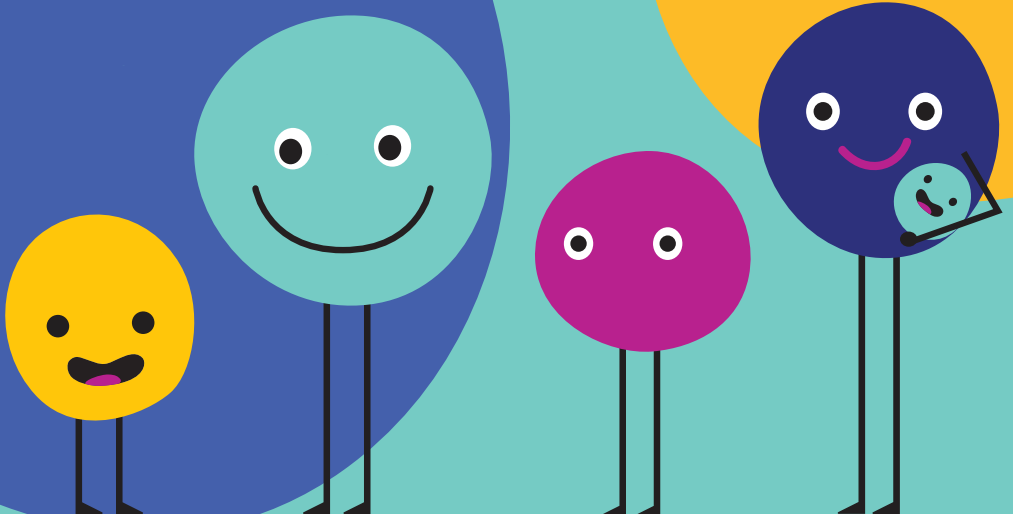

Storytime can be a great way to challenge stereotypes that have been found in many traditional children's books and nursery rhymes.

That's why you may notice our Storytellers swap out particular words, or sing the verse to a song in a couple of different ways. We like our stories and songs to represent real life and the families that join us for Storytime.

We encourage all families to mix up some of the words of songs, to suit their home, family or even just what they are doing at that moment in time.

About Our Storytime Sessions

Baby Rhyme Time (Under 12 months, non-mobile)

Baby Rhyme Time is a free session for babies aged 0 – 12 months, who are not yet walking.

Join us for a relaxed half hour of songs, rhymes and bonding with your baby to support their early learning and your role as their first teacher.

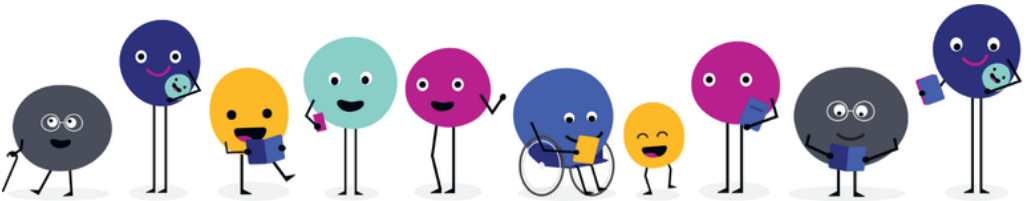
Tiny Tots (Under 12 months, mobile – 2 years)

Join us for this fun, free session designed especially for toddlers on the move to explore, learn and play.

Enjoy the simple stories, songs, puppets, scarves, shakers and more with your little one.

Preschool (3 – 5 year olds)

This is a free session for 3 – 5 year old preschoolers. Join us as we enjoy songs and discover the best books for your preschool aged child in a relaxed environment. Preschool storytime is the perfect place to have fun, socialise and learn tips to support your child's literacy.



- Storytime is for everyone! Make room for all and if you notice a new face, a friendly smile can make all the difference.
- Please refrain from eating during the sessions. This ensures safety and comfort for all and allows children to participate safely in the action songs. Water, milk bottles and breastfeeding are all welcome during our sessions.
- As part of the Frankston City Council Child Safe Policy, we request that no photos or videos be taken during our sessions. Be present with your child and enjoy some screen free time.

Reading with your child

Reading aloud and sharing stories, songs and rhymes with your baby and toddler is one of the most important and enjoyable things you can do together.

It's also a great time for you to bond with your child. Reading to your child from a young age gives them a head start; they often learn to speak, read and write more easily.

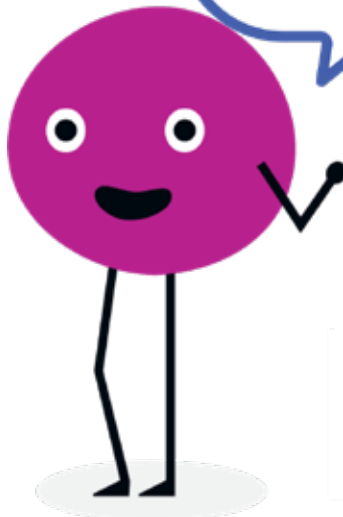

(Clap) La-de-da-de-da,

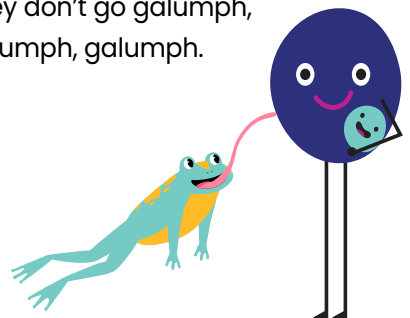

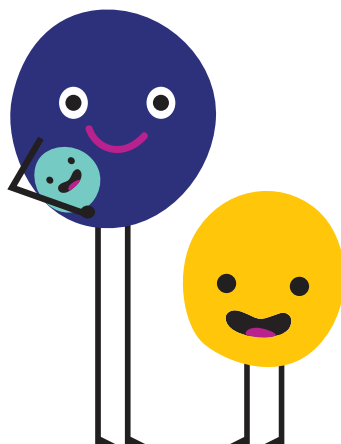

And little fishes, way down below.

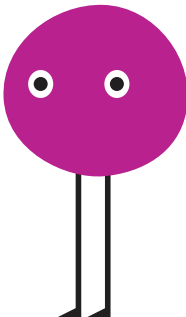
(wiggle fingers sideways like fish)

I can hop like a kangaroo



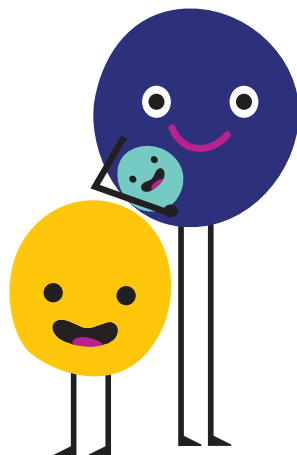
Walk like an old emu

Tip me over and pour me out.

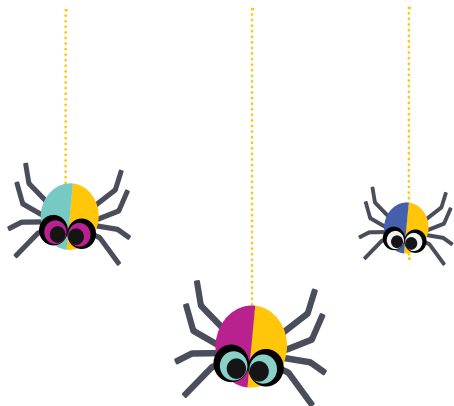
Incy Wincy Spider

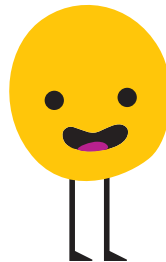

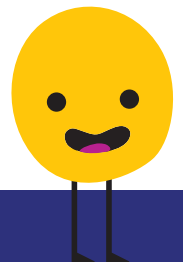

Put a Spot Over Here

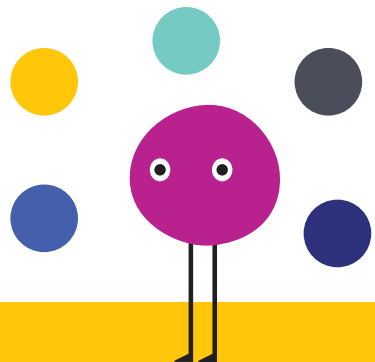
Put a spot over here,

open hand or tummy)*

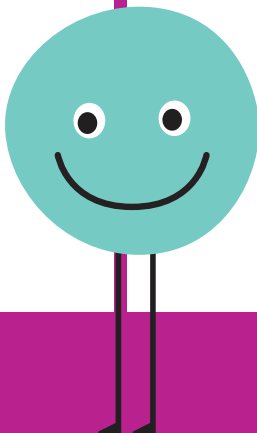
Like a teddy bear.

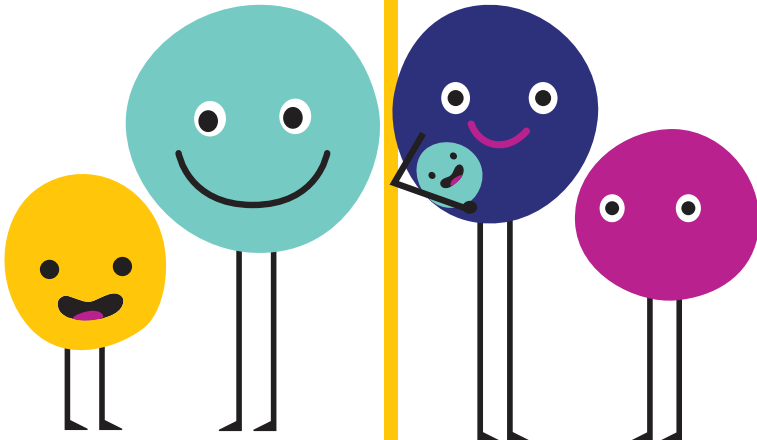

Zoom, zoom, zoom,

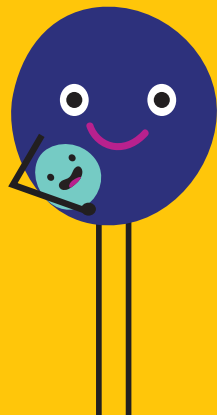
